

ANKUAL REPORT 1985-86

It is my pleasure to report to you, the members of S.T.C. South Camberwell Cricket Club the 19th Annual Report on the activities of the Club.

We once again fielded four sidesin the matting section of the tastern Suburbs Cricket Association and three teams in the Junior Section. We are now the largest matting club in the Association. Although not winning a premiership our on field performances were the Clubs best, for the second consecutive year the first, second and third elevens made the semi-finals with both the firsts and seconds reaching their grand finals. JACK LEAHY

Early in the season we were saddened to near of the passing of Jack Leahy. Jack in fact is the first playing member of the Club to have died. He had not been associated with the Club since 1976 when he moved to Craswick near Ballarat. Jack began his career with the Club in 1971-72 in the 1st Eleven and played in that team for the first two years. In 1873-74 he was appointed captain of the 2nd Eleven when they were defeated in the grand final. In that season Jack scored 314 runs finishing 9th in the Association averages and took 39 wickets to finish 4th in the Association averages. Jack played 33 games with the club scoring 530 runs and took 101 wickets.

1st XI REPORT

For the second consecutive year the first eleven has finished runners up in A Gmade. A good result for the season, but for those involved most certainly a disappointing one.

Our performances over the season were rather haphazard and at times it looked like we may not even make the finals. Our bowlers performed magnificently throughout the year; with four pace bowlers and two spinners we probably had the best attach in the competition.

Our two opening bowlers were Glen Finolay who struggled for form and without luck for 14 wickets and Van Murray who never failed to give us the early break with 19 wickets in 7 games. Our leading wicket takers were out two change bowlers, Pat Wignell being the most successfull with 31 (his best performance in A grade) and Mick Mitchell 29. Mick was our main workhorse during the year and was our most consistent bowler. Although struggling over the last half of the year Chris Hoare finished with 25 wickets and our new leg spinner Bernie Docherty claimed 11 wickets, surely with a lot more to come.

Throughout the year our batting lacked consistency and was probably the reason for our grand final loss. Chris Hoare was not only our outstanding batsmen with 723 runs but also the best in the competition as shown by his win in the A.T.Dunstan Medal. Chris found later in the year that concentration and hard work in the middle bring their reward. Only 3 other batsmen managed to score over 250 runs forthe season. Rob Hoich was our opening bat all year, he showed great improvement and consistency to score 331 runs. Later inthe year Kevin Burt was forced to open with Rob and finished with 435 runs. After being dropped down the order later in the season Bernie Docherty finished the year with 296 runs

We were drawn to play our old enemies A.Y.C. in the semi and after being put into bat showed great consistency to bet all day for 8 for 250 c.c. Chris Hoare top scored with 80, Kevin Burt and Bernie Docherty 41 each and Eugene Fitzwilliam 25. A.Y.C. were never allowed into the game and were all out for 134.Pat Wignell took 4/46 and Mick Mitchell 3/35.

In the final against South Camperwell we batted first but struggled to be all out for 169. We were unfortunate to lose a wicket whenever we looked like building a big score. Bernie Docherty scored 45, Brian McInerney 36 and Chris Hoare 32. South Camberwell after a bad start 2/19 steadied to be 2/60 at tea. After the break wickets fell consistently until they were 9/160 and still requiring 22 runs to win. Unfortunately their No 11 batsmen then played the best innings of the match and their total reached 238.

I would like to thank all members of the team for their support during the year. If everyone can give just that little bit more next year I am sure we will be able to say third time lucky.

2nd XI REPORT

The Second XI topped the C Grade ladder on percentage after the home and away rounds, woth two losses, two draws (both rain affected), seven first innings wins and one outright victory. This fine overall performance was the result of generally consistent and determined batting, tight and occasionally venemous bowling, and fielding which was always of a high standard and sometimes verged on the brilliant. The players responded admirably to the losses of Greg Smith and Mark Duggan (to the U.S.A.and Alice Springs respectively) during the season, particularly Gerard Finnigan. as an opening batsman and Pat O'Callaghan as a new ball bowler.and competition for places in the final team bore out the evenness of the Twos over the season.

The semi-final against fourth placed Deepdene was a thriller. S.T.C. were dismissed for 200 after being 1/116, and Deepdene recovered from 4/34 with a 99 run fifth wicket stand before the last wickets tumbled to give the Saints a win by just 7 runs. Unhappily, the Grand Finalwas not as close, East Doncaster gaining a first innings lead of 112 runs due largely to their better four day approach to the metch. However, the side maintained the spirit and pride of S.T.C. by competing fiercely but fairly throughout the games duration, even after the result was beyond recemption.

Thanks are due to many peaple; firstly, of course, the players, who represented themselves and their club with distinction and courage right through the season. Damian Slattery was a thoughtful and encouraging vicecaptain, and provided constant assistance, and experienced players and forme: captains Doug Paguley, Peter Sandilands and Club coach Basil Finnigan made many invaluable suggestions. The efforts of JustinHoy and Trevor Richardson in the finals as twelfth men, and of Robert Molloy as unofficial thirteenth man in the Grand Final were appreciated, and Ian Constable acted as scorer in both finals with his customary accuracy and neatness. Cathy Krohn and Sue Phelan helped regularly with the important but unattractive task of setting out afternoon tea and cleaning up afterwards, a service for which the players should all be thankful.
