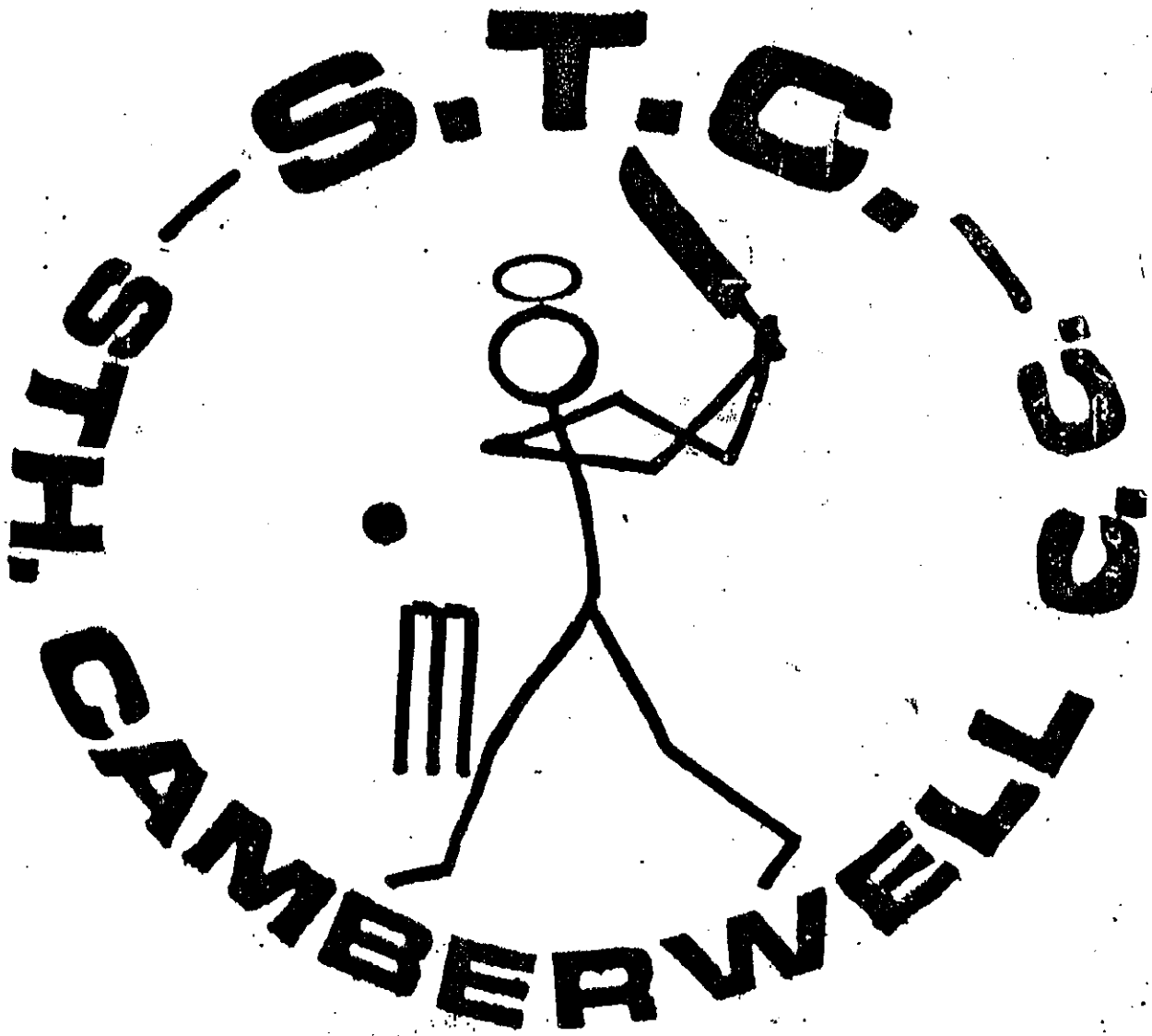

SECOND XI

Promoted to B Grade after losing the 1985/86 C Grade Grand Final, the S.T.C. Seconds enjoyed a generally successful season, heading the ladder after the end of the home and away rounds. This meant that the season's first objective- consolidating a place in B Grade - was achieved handsomely, with only two losses (to the eventual Grand Finalists, A.Y.C. and South Camberwell) before the finals. However bad batting let us down in the semi-final against South Camberwell; 152, even on Howard Dawson Reserve, was too small a total to defend, although determined bowling and desperate fielding made the opposition's task a far from easy one. The team bore itself well in defeat and, even though the match was lost, the players persevered with pride in themselves and in their club until the tenth South Camberwell wicket fell at 237.

Ordinary batting was the main problem throughout the season, with the shining exception of 2/267 V North Balwyn, featuring an opening stand of 166 between Dave Zennaro (124 not out) and Eugene Fitzwilliam (61). In the main, the bowlers were our match winners, with some heroic performances - defending 118 at Mulgrave by dismissing the opposition for 58, for instance, and in a memorable finish at Box Hill South three bowlers - Adrian Barnett (49 not out), Andrew Mackintosh (33) and Mark Duggan (24) took the score from 8/59 to 170, well past the target of 144 and thoroughly embarrassing the so called batsmen. Barney, Damian Slattery and Basil Finnigan all collected 20 or more wickets at niggardly averages and were supported by fielding which at times left the opposition stunned - Mark Griffiths' inspired catching in the gully especially, as well as the great efforts put in by all 29 players during the season

Next season the Twos remain in B Grade, which is essential for the long-term success of the club. But we must not allow the pain of losing a final to fade- every player must remember the disappointment of Labour Day and use it as a spur in 1987/88 to attain that long-sought flag.


