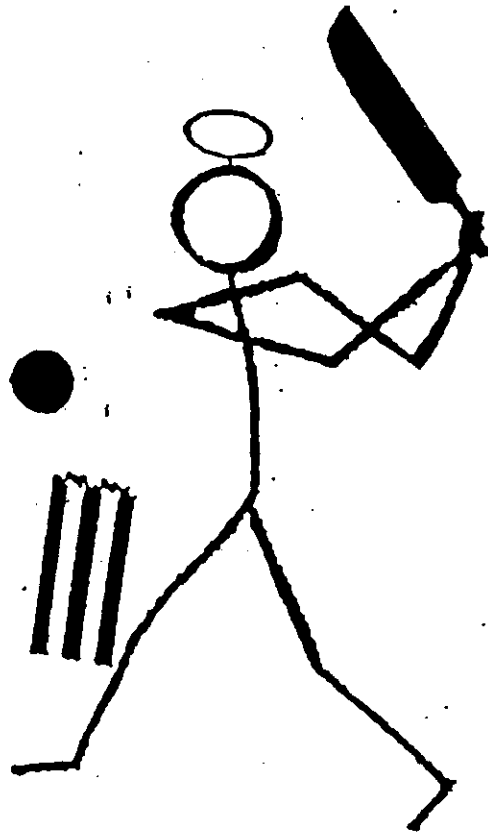

JUNIOR CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

Season 1995/96 was a BIG season for STC South Camberwell junior teams. Although I do not have all records to hand, the six teams and 86 registered players must constitute one of the largest ever representations by this club at the junior level.

The Under 16 Reds won their second premiership in a row and Simon Casey was named player of the final series. The other Under 16 team and the two Under 14 teams finished in the middle of their respective tables. The Under 12 teams had what can best be described as a "development" year.

The club was well represented in the association batting averages. Simon Casey topped the Grace Shield (U16) averages with 126.5 followed by John Brewster (7th) and Stephen O'Connell (9th). Andrew Coffey was 5th in the Martin (U14) Shield with an average of 42.33. Tom Bach was 3rd in the Duerdoth (U12) Shield with an average of 76.25. Our better bowlers failed to take enough wickets to qualify for the association averages but this is largely a result of the club policy of sharing the bowling widely, especially at the more junior levels.

The loss through illness of Basil Finnegan as a member of the juniors' coaching squad on was felt very keenly. Anthony Purcell was hard pressed to effectively manage the forty or so players who regularly attended junior training. It is essential for the development of our junior players that we provide a consistent and well planned training program with enough coaches and senior players to provide individual attention to players who require it.

My involvement in the junior delegates meetings and my discussions with others at these meetings over the year has left me with the impression that our club has a very high retention rate of junior players compared to other clubs in the association who complain that they are losing players to basketball and other sports. I believe that this is a direct result of a number of factors. The club policy of ensuring that all players bat and bowl, especially at the Under 12 and Under 14 levels, gives players a sense of involvement and does a great deal to develop their skills. The encouragement given to junior players by senior players and the welcoming, family atmosphere of Saturday afternoon matches and Saturday evening match reports have an enormous effect on players and their families and encourages them to continue their involvement and allegiance. These are important features of our club and future committees should ensure that these practices continue.

I would like to make special mention of a number of people who have contributed substantially to the smooth running of the Juniors this season. Many thanks to Anthony Purcell who worked tirelessly throughout the year coordinating junior training and managing the Under 16 Blues.

I deeply regret that I will be overseas for the next six months and will be unable to nominate for a second term as Junior Vice-President. Best wishes to the club for season 1996/97.

After the break, the season took on a new complexion with the last 5 home and away games yielding 3 losses, 1 forfeit and a solitary win. We ended up finishing fourth, obviously bemused by letting slip the privileges that go with finishing in the top two positions. Outstanding performances were a little more scarce in these dark times but Tony 'Pops' Michaelides led the way with a gallant innings' of 46 & 58 taking his seasons aggregate to 235 runs....a more than handy foil for Pugs. Josey also emerged from the woodwork and scored some runs including 50 n.o. and his contributions in the field were uplifting to the team. So we went into the semi-final away to top of the table Marcellin quietly confident of some honest parting of cheek.....after all they say all good sides have a mid-season slump, it's just that we got the timing wrong!

We played a blinder in the semi. Winning the toss and batting, Pugsley proceeded to absolutely obliterate the hapless opposition. BY stumps on the second day, Riversdale were 2/28 courtesy of the 'Sheik of Tweak' Byass, who was shaping as the likely trump card for us. On the third day, the opposition arrived with champagne bottles obviously anticipating victory but it wasn't that simple!
