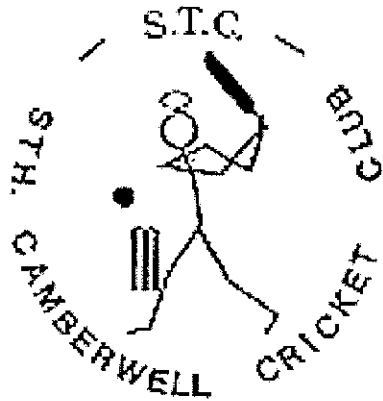

JUNIOR CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

In season 1998/99, we fielded five teams with a total of 57 registered players. Our teams were competitive and all demonstrated improved skills and teamwork as the season progressed. The best performers were the Under-14s who fought their way into the semi-finals and were unlucky not to advance. Congratulations to Michael O'Connell who won the Mitchell Under-14s Shield bowling average (17 wickets at 6.23).

Twelve players moved on from the junior ranks at the end of this season: Ben Banks-Smith, Stephen Brown, Matt Cracknell, Ben Giblett, Joel Murphy, Alex Nicholson, Dan O'Connell, Andrew O'Neill, Tim Parkinson, Tom Sandilands, Liam Sierakowski and Matt Smith. These are very accomplished and experienced players - some have played eight seasons with the juniors - and their contributions will be sorely missed. Some of these players are already playing senior cricket for the club and we hope to see all of them around the club in years to come. We wish all of them success and we thank them for their contributions to the juniors.

In my 1997/98 report, I emphasised the need to put more effort into the development of the juniors. I feel that we made some progress in this regard during season 1998/99.

- The Sunday cricket clinics which we ran for the juniors were very successful. The format involved dividing junior players into small groups and rotating them around specific skills stations manned by senior club players. The juniors responded very positively to this opportunity to receive individual tuition from senior club players. The clinics also resulted in a few new players coming to the club.
- The parents and players match in February was a huge success. The Under-12s played in teams with their parents supplemented by a few senior club players. The Under-14s and Under-16s fielded a combined team which just failed to overhaul a very competitive total posted by the parents.
- Senior players were much more involved in the junior program and made substantial contributions to the clinics, matches, and junior training. Their presence was appreciated by junior players and parents alike.
- We have made some progress in establishing records for the juniors so that we can recognise their milestones and achievements.

Despite these efforts, our junior registrations fell by eight players and we fielded one fewer team in season 1998/99. In addition, we have lost a substantial cohort of Under-16s. There has been increased competition for players from neighboring clubs which has diminished the usual influx of Under-12s. It appears to me that an even greater effort will be required in season 1999/2000.

The work of coordinating the Juniors is substantial and requires a variety of skills. The incoming committee should consider establishing a Junior Committee with the Junior VP as chair and with individuals (parents or senior players) responsible for tasks including recruiting, training, clinics, and administration.

I would like to make special mention of a number of people who have made outstanding contributions to the coordination and management of the Juniors this season. Basil Finnigan, again, made a huge contribution to the juniors and his absence next season will be felt keenly. The managers of the Junior teams kept their teams running smoothly and consistently maintained the club policies of participation and sportsmanship. Thanks to Jack Krohn, George Colman, Chris Shinnars, Stuart Anderson, Peter Morrison, Peter Mercoulia, Dan Muling and Peter Sandilands. I would like in particular to thank the senior players, especially Julian Di Stefano, for the contributions they have made by attending junior training and matches and for their enthusiastic support of the junior clinics and the parent/player matches.

I have enjoyed my role as junior coordinator and my involvement with the committee over the past four years. I wish the incoming committee and the new junior coordinator every success.

TEAM CAPTAIN'S REPORTS

FIRST ELEVEN

When nominating for position of 1st XI Captain for Season 1998/99 my goal was to have the club make great steps towards reaching its full potential by the end of the season. I believed the best way to achieve this was to get individuals to believe in their own ability, whilst forming strong relationships with their club mates. The task was made difficult early on in the season, with uncertainty about who would be playing from week to week.

The 1st XI season started with us being dealt a severe caning by South Camberwell, the team that would be seen as the competition yardstick at the end of the home and away season. A disappointing start, but no need to panic and after all, there was one huge positive to come out that game, the 1st XI debut of Dan Burt, twenty-something runs, three wickets, a clear winner for Man of the Match.

Round 2 was declared a wash out, due to an under prepared Riversdale ground. I believe in the saying "What goes around, comes around," which rang true for Riversdale later in the season.

Our first win for the season came in Round 3 against Mulgrave (Rohan McDowall 111, Danny Sotiriadis 57 and Dan Burt 3/40), which we followed up with our second victory which was against Kooyong and included a club record 5-503 (Ross Moore 223, Rohan McDowall 104, Bernard Docherty 97, Sam Weerasinghe 3/14, Mark Molloy 3/28 & Bernard Docherty 2/25). We then won three out of our next five games leading up to the Christmas break (Sam Weerasinghe 41 & Danny Sotiriadis 4/42 vs Kooyong, Stuart Joyce 4/11, Bernard Docherty 3/14, Danny Sotiriadis 3/31 Sam Weerasinghe 3/44 & David Twaits 3/17 vs Marcellin-2 day, Rohan McDowall 40 vs AYC, Rohan McDowall 71, Peter Warcaba 40*, Stuart Joyce 4/31 vs Marcellin- 1day).

We were in fourth place on the ladder at the break, our run home including the other four teams which made up the top five. In our first game after Christmas we faced South Camberwell again and again we were soundly beaten (Rohan McDowall 81, Ross Moore 40, Mark Molloy 35 & 5/58), however, far from embarrassed. After the loss a few of our team members agreed that some extra training was required to bridge the gap between ourselves and the top teams, so a Sunday morning training session was added to the normal schedule.

Results came immediately, when we defeated third placed East Malvern R.S.L., dominating the game with both bat and ball (David Twaits 65, Peter Warcaba 52, Chris Hoare 46, Luke D'Astoli & Danny Sotiriadis 3/22 each).

In the following match we faced Riversdale, who needed to beat us to make the finals. The game was shortened by several rain delays, effectively destroying any chance of Riversdale winning. In the end, the rain actually denied us victory, when we ran out of overs just a couple of runs short of the asking, but a draw was enough to secure fourth place and a semi-final berth (Rohan McDowall 83, Mark Molloy 50*, Peter Warcaba 44, Luke D'Astoli 4/71 & Stuart Joyce 4/68).

We were defeated by our nemesis AYC in the last home and away game, but an encouraging fight back with the bat gave us something to build on for the finals (Peter Warcaba 48, Luke D'Astoli 42, & Danny Sotiriadis 47).

In the semi-final we met arch-rival South Camberwell at South Camberwell. We batted first and put in an average performance, reaching 207. However, all was not lost. At stumps on the first day, three overs into their innings, South Camberwell found themselves reeling at 2 for 0. On day two, the South Camberwell bats came and went in a procession, which was temporarily halted by an eighth wicket 100 plus run partnership. Once the partnership was broken the final two wickets tumbled and we had South Camberwell all out, thirty-five runs short of our score (Bernard Docherty 47, Danny Sotiriadis 37, Mark Molloy 44 &

4/35). The reaction from STC players and supporters made for one of my most memorable moments in the cricket, when we sang "The Saints Go Marching In" in the middle of South Camberwell's home ground.

The grand final and another clash with AYC. We won the toss and batted.....and batted.....and batted. A good team performance saw us all out in the last of a maximum 120 overs with 280 odd on the board.

AYC got away to a good start with the bat, but we eventually gained the upper hand and wickets tumbled. We were looking very good when AYC were 8 wickets down with 55 runs still to make. However it was not to be, the last three AYC bats rallied and they passed our score with one wicket in hand (Ross Moore 51, Rohan McDowall 46 & Julian Di Stefano 42*). Whilst reaching the Grand Final was satisfying, it was disappointing to get so close only to let the premiership slip in the final stages.

I think getting so close to a flag demonstrated what we are capable of achieving when we really apply ourselves to the task. We will need to make improvements to go the next step, but I don't think the improvements will need to be huge. We are fortunate to have a "well balanced" squad, ie. we don't rely on one or two players to make all the runs or take all the wickets. We have the luxury of being able to field teams with 11 potential match winners. We are able to build partnerships with any of our ten wickets and we have eight or nine bowlers capable of taking a bag on their day. The depth of our squad was exemplified by the tie for this season's Club Champion, taking into account that the batting and bowling averages went to two other players. Four players sharing the top three awards is rare and I believe a credit to our ability to play together as a "team." Whether or not we make the improvements required to win a premiership, I believe will come down to the dedication of the entire squad. As individuals we all have choices to make throughout a season and sometimes cricket loses out to other options. At the end of the day the club suffers. Hopefully, having come so close, cricket won't lose out next season and we will go the next step, but it's up to the individual to commit to the team, the club and team mates.

Congratulations to Terry Spithill and "The Mighty Fours" on their success this season. A great blend of youth and experience and getting the mix perfect when it counted.

Congratulations also to Richard Corbett and Paul Zennaro on fine seasons, leading the field throughout, unfortunately unable to win in the finals. Hopefully, unless they are pushing for selection at higher levels, they will both be back to finish what they have started and if they are, get behind them.

Thanks to all players and supporters for a very enjoyable season. The feeling at the club around finals time was fantastic, lets keep it up and aim for more success next season.
