The club committee & many helpers have been working extremely hard in order to implement some great initiatives: Listed below are the fantastic initiatives the committee & many members have been able to create over the past season or two:

Facilities Upgrade:

- The committee has been heavily involved in the Nettleton upgrade process of design and build, meeting regularly with the council and architects to ensure the new design is tailored to meets the needs of the STC community. The rooms are expected to be completed in time for the 2017/18 season. Thank-you to Paul Zennaro & Joanna O'Connell for your ideas and feedback

Financial Statements & Reporting:

- We have moved our financial reporting to the cloud based version of Quickbooks. This allows a direct data feed from our bank account into the online system. Cloud based accounting allows multiple users to be working on the same system and is a significant upgrade on our excel spreadsheets. James Terrill has been led this change in order to improve our processes
- Financially, the committee is excited to announce a profit of over \$19,500! Far and away the best year on record for the club. Led by a determined Steve O'Connell we have been able to create strong relationships with new sponsors which we look forward to growing into the future

Communications:

- The STC website was upgraded to increase functionality and provide an improved user experience for club members. The new website is part of the MyCricket platform which has been designed specifically for cricket clubs. A big thank-you to junior parent Andros Georgiades, Daniel Sharpe, Adam D'Addazio and Steve O'Connell for many long hours. Adam has spent an enormous amount of time with the design element of the website

- As a result of the above, we are also now managing our membership database through the MyCricket platform. The MyCricket service allows for targeted communication with our members directly through email/SMS and provides increased security for information management.
- The use of MailChimp in place of standard email has also improved our communication with members, allowing for targeted communications as well as providing an advertising platform for our sponsors. There is no doubt, that this is a massive tool for our club to advertise our sponsors and really start to connect with all areas of our community. Another thank-you to Andrea Craine who has taken on this responsibility and run with it.
- The committee also invested significant of time into promoting its social media platforms. Namely its “Official STC South Camberwell Cricket Club” & Instagram pages with over 100 followers. Again, we feel this will become a major platform for the promotion of our sponsors along with easy and consistent interaction with all community members. Cheers to Pete Lacki for his expertise in SoMe.

Player numbers & off-field

- Veterans: In only their second year, we continue to see the Veterans team grow and grow. The current season saw 20 players during the year, with 17 veterans becoming financial members with STC. It was fantastic to see some players at the 50th Anniversary and Senior Presentation night.
- Junior Operations Team: We also implemented a junior ops team this season. Among many other things, the Jops were involved in the creation of our “Junior Philosophy”. Using the results of our survey from the end of the 2016 season, we were able to determine the “STC way” for our coaches and team managers. The philosophy was designed around 5 core principles that resounded from the survey: participation, sportsmanship, enjoyment, development & club affiliation. Through these principles, we hope the kids develop a love for cricket and a love for STC. Thank-you to Bernard Docherty, Tim McMillan, Steve Harrison, Michael Hynes & Steve Hoy.
- Milo T20 Blast: A new initiative for STC this year, we had over 20 milo T20 blasters playing every Friday night in Ashwood. Thank-you to Steve Hoy and the many parents who helped with participation during the year.
- Female Participation: The committee was proud to support a member initiative for the first ever ladies game at Nettleton. It was fantastic to see over 20 ladies at training & their participation in the game. The enjoyment and enthusiasm from our female members will lead this to become a permanent fixture on the social calendar (hopefully against an opposition club next year). Thank you to Eleanor Cowlshaw for the organisation & FashionBiz for the sponsorship of hats and playing shirts for the game.
- Unofficially, we have received a small grant for the advertising, promotion & equipment of ladies cricket at STC. The current committee is enthusiastic of the possibility of having girls teams in the very near future.

First XI Report

Macgibbon Shield

The First XI entered the 2016/17 with a terrific blend of youth and experience, confident we could return to the top of the table after a semi final defeat the season before. A poor start and some rain saw us struggling with one win after four rounds. Two matches against finals contenders Toorak-Prahran and Edinburgh in the next two rounds would define our season. In both games we were chasing 200+ for victory and each time we snatched victory, guided by mature knocks from prodigal son, Mark Shallue and some carpe diem finishing touches from Matt Doran and Richie McDonald. With 8 wickets down, needing 9 runs to win from two balls against Toorak-Prahran, Dora swung mightily to launch a six off the penultimate ball before slapping the final ball over mid off's head to seal victory. It was one of the greatest wins achieved in STC's history and acted as a galvanising force for our squad, as we won six games straight.

Unfortunately, come February, our consistency with the bat largely deserted us and after falling to fourth place, we lost our semi final to eventual premier, Boroondara.

The theme of the year was about giving opportunities to our talented and passionate youngsters, with the round 6 win against Edinburgh featuring seven players aged 22 and under. Callum Dooley, Matt Doran and Matt Thomas led the way with the ball, each showing that at their best they can be forces to be reckoned with in the Macgibbon Shield. Unfortunately the week after taking 5 wickets against Toorak-Prahran in his best figures for the club, Callum broke his thumb and missed a large chunk of the season before returning with menace in the finals. We look forward to seeing him have a breakthrough season with 30+ wickets soon. Dora was extremely dangerous with the new ball in particular, and would've had several more wickets to his name but for some missed opportunities in the slips cordon. He added to his Mr March reputation with a stunning display in the semi final vs Boroondara as he took his first 5-fa in the ones. Matt Thomas also notched his first 5-fa against Glen Waverley, as his accuracy and swing caused problems for batsmen throughout the year.

Mark Shallue left a massive impression with his airtight technique and calm temperament enabling him to score 447 runs for the season, including his first senior century against Clifton Hill. He complemented that with 11 catches behind the wickets in a tidy display that featured a stunning one hander in the semi final. Mark batted many overs at the top of the order with Xavier Wigg, who took on the challenging role of opener, scoring 229 runs for the season. It was a great beginning to his First XI career and with his appetite for hard work will no doubt be the beginning of a long and distinguished career. Paddy Brandner, Richie McDonald and Dom Hando all made valuable contributions too and made particularly positive contributions to the enjoyable playing culture we take such pride in at STC.

Our crop of youth were well supported by our senior heads with both Steve O'Connell and Tom Bach enjoying career best form at stages, each making two tons and two 50s in dominant performances.

As captain, it was a pleasure playing with this group for the year and I appreciate the effort each person made in striving to achieve on field success. Thanks to my vice captain, Sam Fairbrother for his advice and organisation throughout the year. We know that we weren't far off achieving greater success this year which is frustrating but hopefully the lessons learned will hold us in good stead in years to come.

Thanks finally to the committee, their time and effort in organising #clublyf were very much appreciated and make it much easier to captain this great club.

T20

Our T20 squad participated in two competitions this season, once again playing off in the Regional Big Bash off the back of our ECA T20 title last season.

The Kookaburra T20 campaign was a short lived affair despite two thumping victories in the qualifying stage against Salesian Old Boys and Ashburton Willows, where we smashed an incredible 5/215. It took one loss in the qualifying stage against Glen Iris, when fielding an under strength side to seal our exit from the competition and saw us turn our focus to the Regional Big Bash.

Beginning with a match against Box Hill Superkings, we won the toss and batted. Sam Fairbrother (42) and Tom Bach (71) played key roles in helping us put on a very defendable 173. After taking early wickets, we were always ahead of the game before a larger framed middle order batsman got going, striking several boundaries over cow corner. Callum Dooley maintained great composure in the 20th over, and when they needed two to win from the last ball, they could only scramble a single to tie the game. It was a bowl off and we won a tense encounter thanks to hits from Sam, Beau and Paddy.

Next round saw us take on South Yarra at Como Park on turf. Again batting first, we scored freely but lost wickets frequently, leaving us with a precarious total of 134. We began well but when Callum broke his thumb and they put on a quickfire stand of 50 in 5 overs all hope seemed lost as they needed just 11 runs off the final 3 overs with 5 wickets in hand. Somehow Luke and Matt Thomas were able to strangle the opposition, taking the two key wickets and restricting them to 8 runs, giving us victory by two runs in yet another T20 miracle.

Next was Warrandyte at our venue du jour, Ashburton Park. We put together our best all round performance of the year with a phenomenal bowling performance of 9/97 of 20 overs on a beautiful surface. All bowlers were fantastic and Steve, Tom and Mark saw us home in the 18th over for the loss of four wickets.

Our Stars Conference Final was played at our next venue du jour, Schramms Reserve against a Cranbourne line up featuring two former Ryder Medallists. Those two players proved to be massive thorns in our side as they put on 130 of Cranbourne's 169 run total. On a fast outfield we were in with a chance and Tom played one of his best knocks for the club with his 52 off 37 balls featuring shots all around the park. Second XI Report

This season, I'm sure will prove to be no different. Of the 37 players that represented the second XI this year, many of them were under 21 years old. Dion Di Battista, Tom Briggs, James Briggs, Tom Docherty, Richard McDonald, Oscar King, Harry Douglas, Jacob Mackenzie and Dom Hando I'm sure will successfully represent our first XI for many years to come should they choose to.

Tommy Doc, Oscar and Harry are all very competent cricketers and should all be planning on playing higher in the next year or two. Dion showed big clean hitting against AYC, Jacob Mackenzie looked comfortable with both the bat and keeping gloves and both of the Both Briggs boys can quickly punish bad bowling, they also put together a very mature partnership against St Pauls. Despite less grey hair and even fewer parallels to *Pol Pot, Tom Briggs possesses a very similar skillset to a young Beau Coyle. Richie McDonald was a deserving winner of our season bowling average with best bowling of 3-24.

This leads me to Dom Hando who was clearly our best player in 2016/17, winning both the batting average and team champion awards. Opening the batting Dom made 337 @ 33.7 and was unlucky not to also win the Basil Finnegan Medal missing out by a solitary vote. Impressively throughout the season Dom made 2 x 50's, saved outrights vs St Pauls and Mt Waverley Catholics, carried his bat Vs AYC's 1st XI, and was part of a great opening stand of 105 against Glen Waverley Cougars. Most impressively Dom adapted his game this year from defensive to attacking based on the situation. His future no doubt lay ahead in the STC first XI.

Another highlight was to welcome back former junior Ben Rodan. Ben bowled with great control all year which included a 3/23 Vs St James Malvern Valley. Other notable performances this year included Ben Bank-Smiths 75* Vs St James Malvern Valley, Matt Williams 95 Vs Trinity Willison, Brad Craine's 101 Vs Glen Waverley Cougars and Beau Coyle's 4/30 Vs St. James Malvern Valley.

It was also great to have a few old club favourites help the 2's on occasion when selection became difficult. Ro Worthy, Sierra, Chalky, Bernie Doc, Hodgey, Gus Hamilton, Tommy Casha and Michael O'Connell all donated their time. Dan Burt was another who assisted, despite his kind efforts to make

himself available his request to bowl when we were being soundly beaten probably didn't deserve the hostile response it received from the vice-captain; for this I apologise. It was the closest I came to channelling Dan O'Connell all year and Burty should probably consider himself lucky.

To this point I'd like to thank Dan O'Connell for the privilege of being his vice-captain again in 16/17. Similar to last season, this years vice-captaincy duties included team speeches, selection, tossing the coin, presentation night speech, writing the annual report and of course captaining the side. I'd also like to thank Dan for captaining his side in round 13 when I unavailable.

Finally on behalf of the 2nd XI and everyone who represented it this year I'd like to thank all of the executive committee, committee, selection committee, other captains (in particular Fabian D'Addazio), lunch makers (in particular Sue Douglas) and all of the partners of those who played. It was a tough year and without all of your support it would have been much tougher!

I look forward to the challenge of keeping the 2nd XI in the highest possible grade next season.

Third XI Report

With the top 6 all getting starts, we made our way to 196, which at Nettleton is probably below par. However with the bowling attack we had, it could still be defensible. It was a much needed win against a top side which kept our season alive.

Veteran's XI Report

The Veterans came together for our second season with plenty of optimism, feeling we had set up a solid platform to launch after missing the finals in our first year but improving steadily as the season wore on.

Perhaps thrown by our first ever training session before round one, we started with a loss at home, effectively handing Mont Albert the points by dropping their openers five times. The post game debrief around the BBQ concluded we should have won against a team we expected to be one of the competition's strongest, so we took plenty of positives from the game. We also immediately abandoned plans for any future training sessions.

Following the round one loss, we always managed to field a side from our roster of 14-15 players, and were competitive in every game, despite our injury list normally being longer than those claiming to be injury free, and "general soreness" being the norm.

We found ourselves on an Invincibles type winning streak running into Christmas as confidence and momentum quickly grew, claiming several games without getting out of second gear, including:

- a 101 run win against North Balwyn after blazing 266 off our maximum 36 overs
- steam-rolling Burnley in passing their target of 160 in only 16.5 overs. A hard, no mercy edge developing as felt by Burnley's 72 year wicket keeper run out by more than half the length of the pitch first ball
- a clinic at the STC Christmas Party where most took the opportunity to show off in front of the inflated crowd in passing Donvale's target of 158 in just 19 overs. Reliable fill-in Jack Krohn particularly enjoying the day, lobbing a six into the middle of the old blue couch which was graced by his "supportive" fellow club members.

Most pleasing this year was our ability to consistently deliver on our game plan of bowling first and finishing early, affording us extra time around the BBQ and bar.

The highlight of the home and away season was our final game where we needed an away victory on turf at Donvale to secure second place and a prized home final. The guys played brilliantly in a hard fought game and we headed into our first finals campaign full of confidence and with eyes firmly on the flag.

Our semi final went perfectly to plan, holding Burwood to 159 before passing them after only 25 overs, keeping ourselves fresh for the grand final and a round one redemption opportunity against Mont Albert on their home turf wicket a fortnight later.

Despite winning the coveted grand final toss and batting first, only to be bowled out for 87, the game turned out to be a belter. Mont Albert crawled to 0/39 and seemingly had the game well in hand before we sprung to life, taking 3/0 and then upping the pressure with both ball and lip to have them languishing at 7/57. A thick edge to keeper Adams 2 runs later for a brief and glorious moment had us on the doorstep of our inaugural Veterans flag, but sadly the only person at the ground who needed to hear it, didn't, and

from that point Mont Albert regrouped and were able to pass our target with a couple of overs to spare. Although disappointing to fall short, we played with terrific spirit and relished playing in a grand final for the first time for most in many years, reminding us that competitive juices never fully dissipate over time. We really appreciated the huge crowd that came to support us, dwarfing the contingent Mont Albert could muster up at their own home ground. We celebrated the season well that evening, and can only imagine the scenes if we'd won.

Stand out performers for the year were:

- Paul Urquhart who batted consistently and excelled on the turf wickets, making 299 runs @ 74.8, leading the competition batting table by a long way
- Ben Huggins who had an uncanny knack of simultaneously finding both points of difference with opponents and fiery spells of Wasim Akram like left arm, in swing bowling which turned important games, taking 13 wickets @ 11.6
- Pat Hall who performed strongly with both bat (208 runs @ 41.6) and ball (10 wickets @ 20.7), as well as being highly reliable in the field
- Alex Braham who finished top 3 in both batting and bowling aggregates
- Tim Bilston who never failed to bring along his man bag sized esky packed with the iciest Carlton Draft stubbies, and always found one for the skipper.

Thanks to all of the team for their commitment, mateship, and sense of fun throughout the season.

Thanks also to our families, friends and those from the club who came to support us and help out with lunches, scoring and the post game BBQ's.

We have come a long way in just 12 months and are already looking forward to the 2017-18 season.

Hopefully with a little recruiting and a high retention rate in the squad from this year, we will be well positioned to go one better and bring home STC's first Veterans premiership cup.

Junior Program

At STC, we can proudly say we've held a 45 year club commitment to provide local junior players with an opportunity to play the game of cricket. Over the years as junior player numbers and interest have grown, we've continued to enter more teams across the various age groups .

This year we've maintained that commitment providing spots for up to 120 junior players. We entered 8 under teams, 2 under 10 teams, 2 under 12, and 2 under 14 teams and, after an absence the previous season, we fielded 2 under 16 teams to support the players coming through from last seasons under 14's .

Our Milo program enrolled 20 odd 5 & 6 years olds and this season for the first time we formed 3 new T20 blast teams for 7 to 10 year olds.

Next season in response to growing interest we are entering for the first time an Under 15 Girls team and are looking to nominate an Under 18 boys team.

Thank you to all the players and parents that continue to support our junior teams. This continued club growth requires ongoing effort to meet the challenges of providing junior sport. As a consequence the club committee formed a Junior Operations Group (J'ops).

Initially consisting of club president Beau Coyle, club secretary Andrea Craine junior parents Michael Hynes ,Stephen Harrison , Tim Macmillan, Stephen Hoy and junior coordinator Bernie Docherty.

As the season started this group separated to focus on the varying tasks required . Stephen Hoy with Dan Sharpe took on the T20 blast & Milo group , Andie and Beau continued to run the greater club and our Junior operations group ran our 8 junior teams , which includes running Tuesday night training , Friday and Saturday match days, sorting out team allocations, seeking out coaches and team managers, coordinating the Friday and Saturday morning canteen and much, much more.

An important agenda item for our J'ops group was to formalize a philosophy for our STC Juniors. After plenty of consultation and discussion we were able to create an STC Junior Club Philosophy, a philosophy that captures our STC Junior section values based on 45 years of experience .

The team even pushed for an out right win against North Balwyn in the penultimate round of a 45 over two-day match but couldn’t quite get the 20 wickets needed. Nevertheless, STC finished on top of the ladder and the nine matches of the regular season had helped the young men of the newly formed team build a strong team spirit, test their skills as cricketers and understand the capabilities of their team mates.

After a comprehensive win in the semi final against Burwood at Nettleton, including three wickets in four balls to Phil Gikas, STC played Deepdene/Bulleen in the Grand Final.

STC team had beaten Deepdene/Bulleen with relative ease in the match just prior to Christmas. Similarly, the grand final was being played at Highfield Park where STC had played their last match of the regular season and had scored a comprehensive win. So there were no fears going into the grand final.

The day was forecast to be very hot at 35 degrees and with a full 90 overs to be played, the potential for exhaustion from both teams was high. Oscar King won the toss and much to the surprise of the opposing captain and coach, elected to bowl. Oscar knew that his bowling was not only strong but that it was also deep, which would allow him to rotate bowlers to find wickets on a hot day. Welcome Address by Paul Zennaro, Master of Ceremonies

Ladies & Gentlemen,

This year marks fifty since Alan Yarwood famously called over his back fence to Peg Burt - “does your husband play cricket”.

Half a century later we meet here at this amazing venue to celebrate 50 golden years of the STC South Camberwell cricket club.

I would like to begin tonight by acknowledging those who are not with us to celebrate. Both those who have passed, and those who couldn't be here because of their health. One of them is Joe Cain, who on a Saturday afternoon in 1967 became the first STC player to make a 50. Several members of Joe's family are here tonight including his sons Michael and Bryan. On our fiftieth anniversary we acknowledge those, who like Joe, would have loved being here. They are in our thoughts.

Like all volunteer run clubs, STC has been shaped by the efforts of its life members. Their efforts have been so great that they have been recognised with the club's highest honour. Most life members have also been cricketers. And on a Saturday afternoon in 1968 one these life members, Peter Sandilands - who is here tonight with his wife Virginia - became the first STC player to reach 50 wickets. On our fiftieth anniversary we celebrate the contribution of Peter and all our life members. And I would ask the life members to stand and if we could all acknowledge their contributions.

Being a captain at a suburban cricket club can be a difficult task. Putting out mats, paying umpires and making Thursday night phone calls to organise players. In 2007-08 season exactly 50 players represented the fifth XI that was under the guidance of skipper Matthew Funnell. Organising 50 players over 17 games is no easy task - captaining a cricket team never is. Tonight I would like to acknowledge all the STC captains that have made a contribution to this great club over 50 years.

The lifeblood of this club has always been its junior program. So many of us in the room have been graduates of an STC junior education, and gone on to represent STC in senior cricket. In the 2009-10 season a total of 50 young players participated in the Milo Into Cricket program under the guidance of Olympian and STC life member Dr Tim Bach. As we celebrate our golden anniversary I would like to acknowledge Tim and all the team managers and junior coaches that like Tim have made STC so successful.

If the club exists so people can play cricket, few have ever done so as well as a young lad from Valley Parade called Greg Wignell. Wily with the ball, reliable with a bat and quiet in his demeanour, Reg dominated the ESCA competition for nearly a decade. In the 1980/81 season took exactly 50 wickets on his way to winning STC's first ever Dunstan Medal. Greg is here tonight with his wife Sue. To Greg and all players that have taken the field for STC - welcome to this special night.

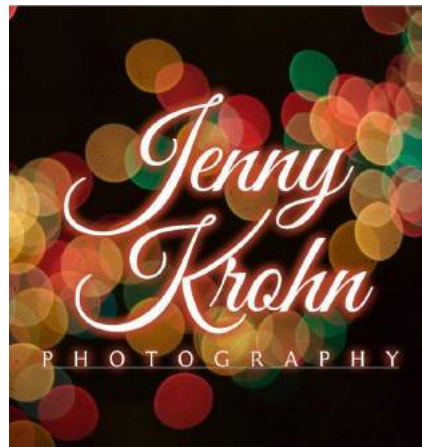
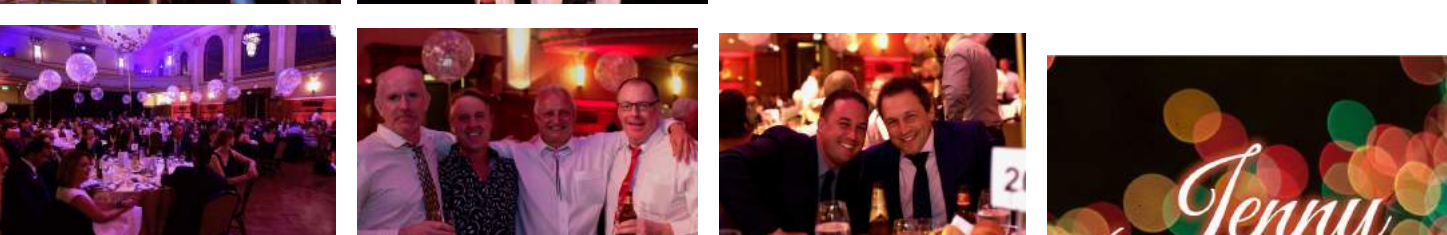

- It was important in the 90s when Phil Byass took exactly 50 wickets and in the early 2000s when Lee Fisicaro averaged exactly 50 with the ball.
- Jimmy Hall's nephew Luke may have only played six games at STC, but he averaged 50 with the bat.
- 50 was the highest score for 80s great Leigh Johndahl's and First XI premierships player Sam Gibblett.
- 50 is the number of catches Dave Pugsley Robinson took as a wicket keeper and Pat Wignell took in the field.
- In cricket a batsman raises a bat at 50, so to STC .. to all of you .. well played on 50.

I would now like to welcome club president Beau Coyle to say a few words.
