President's Report

Second XI Report

Lawrence Colman was the talk of Frog Hollow after his bag of tricks earned him an amazing 8/45 from 19.3 overs in round 6. Loz is one of the smartest bowlers you'll come across and had the batsman constantly guessing as to what delivery would be next.

Going into the 3rd last round of the season we sat 2nd last on the ladder and a hefty chunk of points of our the top 4. Our only chance of finals was an outright. Under 12 Reds

We bounced back the next week to win by 65 runs but then lost the next week by 17 runs. We played in 3 games during the summer where the result was decided by 1 run. The two last games of the year we were on the right side of the ledger and we won both those games.

Will is left-handed and Nick is right handed so you should be able to tell them apart, but when they are both dressed in similar whites and standing next to each other in the field, it's a bit hard to remember whether Will had the grey runners on or Nick wore the blue runners. They filled the coach's day up with difficult questions usually wanting to know where they will be batting next week or where they will be bowling. They clearly had better ideas than

the coaches as we never thought that far ahead, but we always appreciated the fact that they were so keen to be involved.

Oscar Cate played his first year of cricket ever and started out not wanting to play the first game, he just wanted to watch and check things out from the boundary. Good friend Joe talked him into playing because he knew how much Oscar loved cricket so down he came. In his first game he didn't want to bat, was just happy to field. He doesn't play with the best technically straight bat but By the end of the year, I was pointing to Oscar as an example of how to bat for his ability to keep out balls that are directed straight at his stumps. When he walked off the ground in the second last game of the year with his top score ever and a boundary to his name with both hands and bat raised it was one of the highlights of the year.

Some of the other highlights...

Luca Dal pozzo had a solid year scoring more than 30 runs for the year, and taking 4 wickets at an average of 22.

James Scacco had another solid year including a very important last over for the season restricting the opposition to 4 runs off the over, helping us win the game by 1 run .

Jayden Reid only played half the games for the year. When he did play, we were a much a better team. He provides natural leadership and maturity for someone so young. From his stats he was up there with the best bowlers and the best batsmen of the team.

Joe Camilleri and Henry Docherty had very similar years in terms of runs and leadership. They provided about the same amount of runs, but they showed why they were both voted into leadership positions at their respective schools with their presence on the field. Henry has a great technique as a batsman and when he adds some muscle as he gets older will be a fantastic bat, while Joe shows you what hard work and good practice will achieve. I get a close-up view of his practice sessions in the backyard where he will spend hours bowling a ball into a brick wall. He ended up being a hairs breadth away from winning the bowling award, and in that last game of the year, Joe bowled the penultimate over, knocking back middle stump once and conceding just 2 runs when the batters were swinging desperately at everything. He finished with 7 wickets roughly for the year, two behind the ultimate winner of the bowling award but with a very similar average.

Dan Camilleri didn't play last year, but played the year before in the U10's making just 6 runs for the year. Last year however, he had a bit of a growth spurt and this year scored over 100 runs and hit the ball as hard as anyone.

Eddie Goodwin is about the most competitive player in the team. He was the one constantly checking the score and giving us a rundown of run rate required, while everyone else was playing on the swings or whatever Eddie was doing his calculations and determining whether we had a chance to win.

Lucas Huggins - this guy up until round 11 had made a total of 127 runs -he had missed a few games but had made 127 runs and not been dismissed once. He came out in round 12 - he plays very straight and plays most balls on their merits and the bad balls he hits very hard. In round 10 he faced 5 balls and hit 5 boundaries and had to retire on 20. In round 11 he faced maybe 7 balls and retired on 22. In round 12, the unthinkable happened and he missed one and got bowled, so after that game he is averaging 142. A shocking slump in form in the next game saw another dismissal and his average dropped to 74, he finished with an average of 78.5 for the season. He was also our most dangerous bowler, taking 7 wickets for the year at an average of less than 5.

Evan McMahan - this guy is a great competitor with both bat and ball. He does everything the way a coach would ask and would want to see. His bowling is Shane Warne like in the way that he just ambles up to the crease and puts the ball on the spot and lets the batsman get themselves out. In the last game when the ball was not affected by dampness he was turning the ball like Shane Warne. He picked up 9 wickets for the year at an average of just over 8, and also made 76 runs for the year. He is very good at playing himself in and blocking the straight ones. .

Thank you to all the parent helpers and especially to our first year team manager Ben Huggins. Ben also took training each week and played a very important role patiently teaching the boys the skills of the game. Well done and thank you Ben.

The season started with a narrow loss to the Camberwell Magpies and another in the third round to Boroondara. In the second game we had a wonderful win over Clifton Hill; their only defeat of the year. In this game we witnessed one of the many outstanding knocks by Ben Tricarico (278 runs for the season at an average of 55.6) and also discovered that we had a very handy batsmen in Mitch Ryan who being our opening quick came in at the tail and hit some well-timed boundaries. Our third and biggest loss of the year was to Mont Albert but it was also the turning point of the season. While Mont Albert made 222 runs, batting first, Ethan Boal took 3 for 12, our spin twins Tom Swift and Dom O'Leary chipped in with

wickets and Richard Bland took 3 wickets in the last over. It was the first time that we had dismissed the opposition. In reply we made a very respectable 163 runs, most of our batsmen got starts and we survived our full 45 overs. The opposition commented that we were the best team that they had played. The boys took a lot of confidence away from this match. We were no longer just a good bowling team but we had proven that we could bat too.

In the two one day games prior to Christmas we enjoyed strong wins against Kew Red and Burwood United. Highlights from these matches included big innings by Ben, Mitch, Zac, Nick and Ethan, a blinder of a catch by Tom, and fantastic bowling from Hayden and Ethan in particular. Zac Gucciardo completed a wonderful match by finishing on a hat-trick.

After the holiday break the team continued on in the same vein and won all three matches. Time and time again the boys dug themselves out of tricky situations to win. In round 7 we chased down a competitive 112 (one day match). Ethan enjoyed an outstanding game with bat and ball. Round 8 against North Balwyn was “edge of your seat” stuff. Batting second and chasing 176 we started solidly but then lost three quick wickets. Under 16B Premiers

With healthy numbers across the age group the club was able to field two teams at the U16 level. The U16 Reds competed in the A R Tongue B grade section of the ECA junior competition with a squad of 12 players many of which were playing their final year of junior cricket with 8 having commenced with STC in the under 10's .

After the completion of the early rounds it became apparent that this squad had the depth and balance to push for a finals berth. And so it proved as the Reds remained undefeated at the end of the home and away season having explored many paths to victory. Be it the grinding win against Richmond or the epic run chase against Edinburgh to beat a feisty opponent and imminent electrical storm or T20s at Nettleton, the boys always had an answer.

Having a team of 12 experienced capable players, a requirement for the season was the willingness of the boys to take their turn and share opportunities with fellow team mates .

Hugo Goodman, Ryan Driscoll and Ben McMahan typified this approach and contributed greatly on many occasions throughout the season helping turn close encounters into comfortable results our way . Harry McLean's glove-work for the first half of the season , Kieran Yeates with his power hitting and Jack Francis fine tuning his leg spin bowling, were considerable factors in the performance of the team, cascading into a thoroughly dominate season .

Finals

Having earned the right to a home semi-final at Nettleton Park the Reds got off to the best possible start with Tom Docherty and Lucas Harrison unleashing a ferocious new ball attack to have Bulleen Templestowe teetering at 6/26 after the first hour and all out for 67 after 26 overs. As the Sunday morning crowd started to drift in Sam Briggs and Oscar King clubbed and stroked their way to 1/75 after 9 overs denying all of some afternoon entertainment but securing the grand final berth with a minimum of fuss.

Now installed as flag favourites, the Reds and their army of supporters were buoyed by the ECA allocating Ferndale Park as the neutral venue for the grand final versus Richmond Union. However, when grand final Sunday arrived it brought gale force winds from Antarctica which saw spectators and teammates huddling in the clubrooms as Gikas and Briggs opened up for STC. Both sides grappled with the conditions for the first hour before the storm blew over to reveal blue sky and STC starting to build the foundations of a defendable score. Once established Phil Gikas (71) and Oscar King (45no) began to escalate the scoring and the STC batting line-up continued to shift through the gears to reach an imposing 3/219 off 45 overs with some entertaining cameos from Joel Lagastes (22 n.o.) , Tom Docherty (26) and Ben McMahon (16 n.o.)

With 219 on the board and an attack boasting 6 genuine quicks and a quality leg spinner, STC were justifiably confident of getting the job done but Richmond were clearly in form with the bat after a huge run chase in their semi-final . Docherty (2/7), broke the initial resistance after 8 overs, the next wicket followed shortly after when Harrison (1/8) thundered through the oppositions gun bat with the in-swingers of the season and from there a steady succession of wickets followed to 7 different bowlers (Francis 2/9, Lagastes 1/9, Driscoll 1/0, McLean 1/6, Briggs 1/6) culminating in Richmond being bowled out for 62 in 28 overs.

With many boys graduating to senior ranks next year it was a real highlight to cap their junior years at STC with a premiership.

Also contributing to the success of the team this year was the fantastic support the boys and coaches received from their parents and friends. Whether it was assisting with warm ups, marking out the ground or sitting in a deck chair it all helped create a positive atmosphere from which the boys were able to learn and enjoy the game.
