President's Report

It is with great pleasure that I present this, the 56th annual report of the STC South Camberwell Cricket Club.

Well what a brilliant and exciting season we had. If we thought last season was great, then this was even better. And one like we haven't seen in 20 years.

Last season we welcomed the 6th team back to club after 10 years, this season we not only went one better, we went two better. For the first time ever we added a 7th team and even more exciting was adding a girls team that played for points.

As I mentioned at the Presentation Night, success is different for each and every one of us. One might think that because we didn't win any flags, that it wasn't a successful season...I beg to differ. Let's look at the success that the club should be extremely proud of this season:

- The 1stXI played in the Grand Final. A great effort by any measure but in doing so they
 will return to the highest synthetic grade in 2023/24 Macgibbon Shield. This was the
 priority of the team for the past 2 seasons.
- The 6th XI, after just missing finals last season, went one better and played in semi finals this season.
- The 2 Vets Teams played in Grand Finals in their respective divisions. The first time that has occurred at STC.
- The inaugural 7th XI team commenced and played most of their matches on turf wickets and almost made finals in their first season.
- The inaugural Girls team commenced and played for match points and topped the table in their first season.

There are still more accomplishments that we need to be just as proud of:

- STC still has not have to forfeit a senior game in its history.
- We have heaters for those chillier nights.
- We did not raise our subs post COVID (in fact we reduced them) and still broke even financially.
- We had several players (both senior and junior) selected to represent the ECA.

The success and credit for getting the Girls team up must go to Stevie O'Connell for his participation and perseverance during the past few years and the links that we have with girls – afterall he has 3 of them, so he didn't really have a choice. But for this, Steve was deservedly awarded the Junior Club person for this season.

The success and credit for getting the 7thXI team (or as they has self-titled themselves – Sunday 1stXI) up must go to Nick Adams for his dogged perseverance to get the team up and running and backing his judgement. Having a Sunday option to play will see more players be retained at the club if they can't play Saturdays any more. And we must thank Jack Krohn, Sid Jines and Nick Fennessy for leading the team throughout the season. But for a few close games, they could have been finals bound. As they say – they will be better for the run.

The on-field success is always due to the committed work of the Selection Committee in the ever-difficult task of balancing the many considerations in the selection process. Even with the extra teams each week, once again STC were able to field full teams each and every game. It wasn't easy and the senior teams must give a big thanks to the myriad of Juniors who stepped up, stepped in and helped out. We have seen some real diamonds being unearthered with these kids.

It was lovely to celebrate our Presentation Night in is such style. As we were unable to have the 55th anniversary Celebration, this season we thought it would be best to combine it with the normal annual presentation night – a super joint event if you like. And there was nothing normal about it. We announced the Team of the Decade. We welcomed not 1, not 2 but 4 new Life Members to the club – Peter Morrison, Stuart Hamilton, Tom Sandilands and Tom Bach. Each one of these gents a fitting and unanimously agreed addition to the status pf Life Membership.

We also must congrats those former players that were elevated to STC Legend Status – Steve O'Connell. Luke D'Astoli, Sam Fairbrother and Adam D'Addazio, John Aspinall and Michael Cain.

While it is impossible to name everybody that contributed during the year, I would like to sincerely thank you all for your efforts, in particular the tireless effort of the Executive Committee – Paul Tesoriero, James Terrill, Joe Moorhead and Nick Adams. I'd like to thank the whole committee for their constant and continued commitment to putting 7 senior teams, 2 Vets teams, 1 girls' junior team and 8 junior boys teams out on the field each week. First XI Report- Burt Shield

This season felt like a revelation for the First XI. A semi-final tie knocking us out last season was a rough way to end, but the squad was determined to go even further this year. Bolstered by some off-season recruits, I certainly felt like we were going to be able to have a real crack at the flag.

Frustratingly, weeks on weeks of rain made it a difficult start to the season! This was only further compounded by perhaps our worst performance of the season in our first game. When we did finally manage to get back out on the park in between wash outs, we managed to hit the ground running in the way that we had hoped to. A 93 run defeat of Northcote was just what we needed. A first First XI half-century for Tom Docherty, and a debut 40 for British recruit Frazer Fennell, were crucial to this performance.

This kicked off a string of great performances for the team. 4 wins in a row, including 2 close victories over a team that was competing in Macgibbon last season saw us stamp ourselves on the competition. Highlights in this period included Tom Bach's 87 (49) against Toorak-Prahran in Round 7, which illustrated his incredible hitting prowess. Round 8 was our first 2 day game in a number of years, and that also ended up being a remarkable game. We saw the beginning of what would become the best 1-2 punch in the competition, with Cal Dooley returning to form and his fellow Western Australian Joel Holmes starting to really find his feet. Bowling them out for 170 felt like a great result. Frustratingly, at 5/34 and then 7/68, things looked dire. However this time Tom Bach (101*) showed his immense ability to control a game, and partnered with an incredible rear-guard defensive effort by Frazer Fennell (19 off 69) ensured that we managed to scrape home thanks to their 103* partnership for the 8th wicket.

A very different side took to the field coming up against old rivals Glen Waverley the week after. 5 players under the age of 20, including a debut for 16yo Saveen Seneviratne, made for exciting times. Joel Holmes continued his rise, taking 5/31 including the 2 wickets of those that would become the competitions leading run scorers. Though we fell 20 runs short of our goal, Henry Lasscock showed us his huge potential by top scoring with a very well made 80 (123), despite waking up that morning and testing positive to COVID.

At the Christmas break with 4 wins and 2 losses, we felt pretty good. We continued our frustrating form however as we lost 3 in a row, including 2 the very first weekend back as we were forced into a Saturday/Sunday death. Cal and Joel continued to take wickets, Turbo continued to score runs but we just weren't quite clicking.

This looked like it was continuing in round 11 with our 2 day game against Notting Hill-Brandon Park, as we stumbled from 0/42 to being 7/63. Luckily, Hamish Macmillan (9 off 54) got the opportunity to throw his name forward and showed how his continued efforts in training were paying off as he spent considerable time at the crease against a fearsome bowling attack. We hoped that, despite being all out for 131, it might be just enough. We knew though that with our bowling attack, we had a chance. Cal kept us right in the game, taking early, and seemingly constant wickets. Matt Doran chipped in with a crucial run out to remove their highest scoring batsmen. Overnight, we had them 9/120 and it was a tense week. Cal managed to complete his 5-fa, and find us a 2 run win, in the fifth over of the morning.

The 3 final rounds were sure to be interesting, as things got to the pointy end of the season. It was tight on the table, so nothing less than 3 wins would ensure our place in finals. Somehow, we managed to upset the apple cart a little bit as we picked up 2 outrights in a row. West Ivanhoe, who we had lost to in the first game of the season, was a massive game for us. Cal taking 2 wickets in the first over was very handy, as was Rusty (in game 200) taking 2/7 off 11 overs (with 7 maidens). We passed them on the final ball before Tea on Day 2, at which point everyone expected to pack up and go home. I had other ideas though, and much to everyone's shock, we played on. Luke Worthy (4/4 off 7) and Harry Douglas (3/12 off 7) saw us bowl them out within 30 overs, and for under 50 leaving us chasing 49 off 11 overs. Turbo and Mark Shallue ensured we got there with no troubles, ensuring a famous win.

Clifton Hill the week after was a fair bit simpler. Cal took 4/22 to help us bowl them out for 108 before Matt Doran, Mark Shallue, and Tom Docherty got us to a healthy score. Within 2 overs of their 2nd innings, we had them 2/2 and things felt almost inevitable. Everyone chipped in and gave us an Innings and 17 run win, that gave us a chance all of a sudden at 2nd spot and a home final.

Sadly that wasn't to be, as Northcote forfeited the final round and we went into the semi-final well rested, but anxious to ensure we didn't get anywhere near a tie!

Finally able to field our strongest XI for perhaps the first time all season, we went in feeling pretty confident. Winning the toss and bowling surprised a few onlookers, and at about 3/90ish at lunch, it looked to be a potentially costly error. However, just as we had earlier in the season against the Catholics, we came out after lunch and absolutely blew them away. Having them all out for 123 we went into the sheds feeling good. 24 overs later, and a brilliant first First XI half century for Lachie Macniel got us over the line and made sure that we wouldn't need to come back for day 2.

Our return to the Big Dance made for an anxiously excited week. Up against Glen Waverley again, who hadn't lost a game all season, we were as ready as we could be. Our season kicked off against local rivals, Glen Iris CC, at Howard Dawson Reserve. Our next match was against Mount Waverley Uniting at Jingella Reserve. Unfortunately we were not switched on for the game with a couple of players (including both our opening bowlers rocking up late, which was especially unfortunate given that we were sent into the field). Mount Waverley Uniting posted 2/266 and their captain made 100, which was particularly disappointing as we needed three hands to count how many times we ended up dropping him. Patrick O'Brien was the only bowler who could keep his head high taking both of our wickets. Joey Moorhead and myself opened the batting and we got off to a flyer. Joey made 38 off about 20 balls. I ended up making my maiden century and Ollie Schleiger provided formidable support at the other end. However, we were unable to chase down the total set for us, finishing 4/222.

We then faced Bulleen CC twice in consecutive weeks. We were to play the first match at Willsmere Reserve (as Bulleen's home ground was still rain-affected). In a strange turn of events, Burwood Uniting and Richmond City (LOC6 teams) also rocked up to play at Willsmere on that Saturday. Ollie Schleiger took 2/21, Cam Timms 2/29 and Gaz Douglas 2/33. It turned out to be a very tight and exciting chase, with Sam Matheson (a fill-in and a great bloke) hitting two sixes off a spinner (if you could call him that) to win the game with only a handful of balls remaining. David Kuster and Ollie Schleiger also starred with the bat, making 54 and 30 respectively.

We then faced Mount Waverley Uniting for the second time, this time at a rejuvenated Warner Reserve. Unfortunately for us their 2nds had the week off and they absolutely stacked their LOC4 team. We posted 9/150 with the bat (David Kuster made 42, Tristan Hunt made 32 off about 11 balls and Ollie Schleiger made 28). It turned out that we simply did not have enough runs on the board. A big highlight though was Tristan Hunt taking a fantastic catch in the outfield to dismiss one of their opener (who was playing well below his grade) for 94 when they only needed 4 or 5 runs to win. Another highlight was Tim Schleiger (the lone STC onlooker at the game) standing up for his mates after he heard some crude and unwarranted banter (if you could call it that) from the large opposition supporter base during our fielding innings. In the next round, we faced off against cellar dwellers, the Mount Waverley Catholics. We bowled first because at 12.30pm they only had 3 players there and we felt sorry for them. We played Ashburton Willows at Ferndale Park in the last game before Christmas. We lost the toss and were sent into the field. It did not start well with Ashburton racing to none for about 120 off 20 overs. We rolled the dice after the break, putting on Joey Moorhead for some leg breaks (if you could call them that), and what a decision that would turn out to be! Joey dismissed their star opening bat for 58 with a clip to the keeper down the legside and it was all up from there. Gaz Douglas took 2/28 and Kane Quinn (or is it Quinn Kane?) took 2 catches and managed 2 run outs, as we held Ashburton to 6/199. Pauly Tesoriero and Joey Moorhead opened the batting and they got us off to a flyer! Paul smashed 2 consecutive fours and ended up on a career-high of 12. Joey was having the game of his life and also smashed his high-score, finishing on 68. From there, we lost a few quick wickets, but Osh Siyaguna (36) and Alex Braham (55 not out) steadied the ship and we achieved a fantastic victory.

After Christmas, we were matched up against the top team in the competition (Mulgrave) two weeks in a row. The captain of Mulgrave was Nick Parker and he was playing well below his grade, having already made 3 or 4 centuries before Christmas. We knew we up against it when we travelled out to Mulgrave on Sunday (bloody Sunday) on what was going to be a boiling hot day. We were sent into the field and it was disastrous from there. Nick Parker made his way to yet another century after being dropped a couple of times (including a dolly to the keeper which self-reportedly got stuck in the sun for a little while) and Mulgrave posted a humungous 7/317 (Jackson Reeve with top figures of 2/65, eek!). We had Nick Jamieson (a very, very good

Dunstan Shield cricketer filling in for us) and he cruised his way to 118 not out, but even that was not enough, as we could only manage a total of 210 before being bowled out. David Kuster also made a formidable 34.

After the Mulgrave thrashing, the STC 4s skipper decided to take a 2-week holiday to Thailand to recover. That left Joey Moorhead in charge (who during the week was boasting to anyone who would talk to him – which admittedly was not many – that he had never lost a game as skipper). To Joey's credit, he led from the front. We won the toss and batted first, and posted a good (but not great) total of 173 all out at Warner Reserve. Tristan Hunt and Joey made 48 and 41 off not much respectively. Patrick Martin top scored with 25. Loz Coleman went on a rampage early with the ball (taking 4/12 from his 8 overs), but these heroics were not enough to save the day, with Balwyn Saints chasing down our total with relative ease (7 wickets down). The ever-reliable Cam Timms took another 2 wickets for 26 runs.

After losing three consecutive games against Mulgrave(x2) and Balwyn Saints, we really needed to have a strong end to the season to make finals, and we did start to turn our season around in the next two weeks.
